

KEYSTONE FCU AWARDS \$1,000 SCHOLARSHIP IN 15th ANNUAL ESSAY CONTEST

WEST CHESTER, PA — Keystone Federal Credit Union has announced the winners of three scholarships awarded to high school seniors from Chester County.

A scholarship worth \$1,000 was awarded to first place winner Aimee Rosenbaum from Twin Valley High School. She has not yet decided what school she will attend this fall.

The second place winner, receiving a \$500 scholarship, was Elizabeth Erbe from Henderson High School in West Chester. Erbe plans to attend Shippensburg University.

Kyle Phillips, also from Henderson High School in West Chester, took home third place and a \$250 scholarship. Phillips is currently undecided about which school he will attend this fall.

The scholarships were awarded based on the results of an essay contest sponsored by Keystone FCU, the educators' credit union. This is the 15th year that Keystone FCU has sponsored the essay contest and scholarship program.

The essays addressed the topic: The Importance of Maintaining Good Credit: How Will the Way I Handle My Credit Today Affect My Future? The topic was intended to persuade graduating students to begin thinking about the importance of decisions they will soon make regarding personal credit.

Eligible entrants included seniors attending schools within Keystone FCU's field of membership or seniors who are members of Keystone FCU. Keystone FCU's field of membership includes all public schools and selected private schools located in Chester and contiguous counties.
